

"Hallowed be Your Name" Prayer Walk

Prayer walking is when we take prayer beyond the walls of our church or home and to the very places and people that we are praying for. In the Old Testament, Joshua and Caleb walked throughout the Promised Land with a desire to see it as God saw it. In Nehemiah, he walked through Jerusalem with a God-given burden and a sensitive heart to see what God was planning for His people. We prayerwalk, asking God to give us a vision of how He wishes to bless our neighbors and transform our neighborhoods through His Name.

Instructions:

- 1. **Prepare**: Ask God to make you sensitive to His heart and your surroundings. Invite Him to guide your steps and your words.
- 2. **Walk** through your neighborhood. Keep your heart open to God impressing you to pray for the people and homes that you see as you walk.
- 3. **Pray God's names** over the places and people you see. (see the resource of God's 8 hyphenated names) For example: Pray that He would be their Provider; that they would know He is Present with them; etc.
- 4. **Watch** for changes that God starts to work and for opportunities to be involved making God and His love known in your neighbors' lives in practical ways as a result of the work you do in prayer.

Notes:

- A prayerwalk can be very low-key. No need to make a scene.
- You don't have to pray every one of God's names over every house.
- Take the Eight Names resource sheet with you or make your own sheet.
